Community and Progress Association Meeting

- A great meeting was held on Friday night 24th May with a group of more than 30!
- The Draft Heritage Area Plan prepared by Lake Macquarie City Council (LMCC) was presented by LMCC representatives.
 - The Council officers accepted that there has not been sufficient community consultation in preparation of the draft and will consider an extension of the usual 4 weeks of the exhibition period. Also, they supported the meeting's suggestion that a workshop be held on a Saturday afternoon at the Bowling Club to collect the communities concerns regarding the draft plan. Community members will be notified as soon as workshop details come to hand.
- The Association members discussed other issues and these are summarised as follows.

Community Survey Results

- The survey's results will be considered in CHBPA's future policies, as well as forwarded to LMCC's Councillors, as well as Federal and State Members.

- The Progress Association has been successful in securing a grant from the Federal Government for \$10,000 for the preparation of material relating to self-guided heritage walking trails at Catherine Hill Bay.

<u>Coal Trolley – Mission Not Impossible</u>

- The LMCC's heritage funding assistance for the restoration of the skip (up to \$1000 on a dollar for dollar basis) has been withdrawn due to onerous restraints placed on the Swansea Mens Shed and others. Nothing like a challenge!
- The skip's pieces (before and after photos) are to be returned to the Bay where we will pool our skills and get this trolley built. Goal is to have finished for the October 2013 Back to the Bay Festival.

Bay Care - Vast Improvements

 Since early 2013 the Association has been meeting with Council Officers to address problems around the Bay including the surf club and picnic / BBQ areas. To date, broken fencing, loose wire, old waste bins and the dilapidated BBQ area have been fixed.

We have been advised that resurfacing of the poorly sealed car parking area is to be budgeted for 2013 / 2104. Also, some fencing in this area is to be upgraded and budgeted for 2013 / 2104.

Another bench / seats plus some possible shading are planned for the BBQ area as well as the grassed area south of the Club.

Weed Eradication - Lake Coal

 In April, Lake Coal's weed eradication contractor started poisoning Lantana (South America) and Bitou (South Africa) in the valley on eastern side of Clarke St – between Lindsey and Montefiore. This program is to include Pamas grass (South America), Blackberry bushes (Europe) and selected Coral trees (possibly New Zealand), and will recommence June, weather depending.

Cleanup Day

• 12th May – Mothers Day –Association volunteers joined Project *Aware on the Coast* to clean up the coast around graveyard beach. About 1 tonne of glass and plastic bottles and other interesting paraphernalia was collected.
