Belmont Catchment DevelopmentContributions Plan

Lake Macquarie City Council (LMCC) has issued their draft Belmont Catchment Development Contributions Plan for public comment. This Plan, which covers an area from Belmont North down to Moonee Beach in the south, proposes a number of **important investments in community facilities in Catherine Hill Bay** over the next 15 years. Comments are invited from the public with a deadline of 14 March 2018. The PA supports the Plan and has drafted a submission to Council (refer attached).

We also strongly encourage you to make your own submissions to Council at <u>council@lakemac.nsw.gov.au</u> prior to 14 March 2018.

A summary of the main proposals in the Plan for Catherine Hill Bayare as follows:

- Demolish and rebuild the Surf Club (\$5.5m) further back from the beach than the current location. Council plans to acquire land from Rose Group to enable this relocation.
- Creation of an expanded Coastal Park around the new Surf Club.
- Build a new 400m² community use facility/building (\$2m), either at the Bowling Club site or incorporated into a new larger Surf Club.
- A new playground (\$1.4m) and expanded sports fields/facilities (\$8m) in the area adjacent to the Bowling Club.
- The plan includes a coastal walk spanning the length of Catherine Hill Bay connecting Main Camp and Middle Camp, but proposes that it will be built as part of the DA obligations of developers.
- Council plans to acquire land owned by Wallalong Lands P/L around the bowling club and sports oval area. This will enable them to provide the expanded sports fields and other facilities, and would also give Council ownership of the access road to Graveyard beach.

Traffic safety

Traffic calming speed humps have finally been installed over summer by LMCC. This is a great step forward in managing the dangerous driving problem in our town. More are planned in future stages. Please do not mistake these humps for pedestrian crossings.
